### 01. Crime/Safety Report:

#### Discussion:

- Announcement of speakers to be present at Nov. 16th crime and safety meeting at Taborspace
- Since Richmond Tag Busters have been cleaning graffiti for a year, neighborhood signs have been staying clean, not getting retagged
- Frequent notices on NextDoor of packages stolen off porches send letter to postal service about hiding packages?

- People coming to doors with packages pretending to be making deliveries
- Suggestion that people post signs indicating where to place packages

## 02. PPB Request Letter: Enhanced Patrol

 Erik Matthews drafted a letter, ready for review and approval this evening. The letter and an alternate version describing a specific incident that was discussed on NextDoor were read aloud.

#### Discussion of which letter to send

- A letter mentioning a specific incident with the woman in the park might get more attention, or it might distract from the rest of the letter. We might need the woman's permission.
- Request that police start doing a foot patrol and engage some of the individuals that have been causing problems, build community, get police out of their cars
- Suggestion of scheduling a single-issue meeting to talk about crime and safety concerns, after the Nov. 16th meeting at Taborspace
- cc the commissioners on the letter?
- There used to be a Hawthorne foot patrol. If that was stopped, can we ask them to restart it
- Matt made a motion to send the letter, opened up for friendly amendments, and Jan seconded
- Allen moved to add a request for reinstating Hawthorne foot patrols
- Matt moved to send the letter that Erik drafted with the friendly amendments about Hawthorne foot patrols, Sewallcrest foot patrols, increased city wide park patrols, and to increase the audience to include the mayor and the city commissioners and Chief Outlaw
- The board voted with unanimous approval of all members present (Lauren Sher not present); the motion passed

# 05. Residential Infill Project: Letter of Support

- Matt Otis presenting
- Go to land use news on Richmond website for proposed developments
- Discussion of 3-step process
- No action was taken by the board. Moved on to other Land Use and Transportation Committee topics, planning to discuss RIP later in the meeting.

### **06. Division Transit Project**

- Matt Otis presenting
- Show of hands of who attended the Division Transit Project open house. Flyers on the table.
- Review of the Division Transit Project website/online open house
- Please go to an open house (or website) for comments on bus stop locations and design.
- Richmond NA has already supported/recommended electric buses, other neighborhoods have too.
- No action was taken by the board.

# 07. Ladd-Harrison-Lincoln Greenway: Letter of Support

• Matt Otis presented on the development of the Ladd-Harrison-Lincoln Greenway Project.

- The presentation included an overview of what greenways are (goal of vehicles traveling 20mph or less, daily average approximately 1,000 cars per day with an upper limit of 2,000, and ample opportunities for crossing busy streets), a review of data indicating that traffic counts and speeds are far exceeding the established goals, the purpose of diverters vs. speed bumps, and a list of ideas proposed at the LUTC meeting.
- Community members commented both in support of and in opposition to the diverters.
- During the commenting period, David and Nina Silberstein handed out a letter to the board and presented a petition with 184 signatures opposing traffic diversion at SE Lincoln and SE 30<sup>th</sup>. David read the letter aloud and requested a letter from the board in support of the petition.
- During the conversation that followed, people voiced concerns about the request for support not following the procedure for requesting space on the agenda, and board members discussed options of extending the meeting or scheduling a special meeting to discuss RIP.
- It was also mentioned that many community members had spoken in favor of diverters during a presentation by PBOT at a previous meeting of the neighborhood association. David questioned whether those supporters actually lived in the neighborhood and requested to see the sign-in sheets. When another community member commented in favor of diverters, David asked twice whether she was signed in. Some people noted that they felt the request was threatening.
- Jan left the call at 9.
- No action was taken by the board.

# 08. Residential Infill Project, continued

- Brief overview of RIP by Matt
- Heather pointed out a change from R5 to R2.5 and asked about the number of units that will be permitted in R2.5 zoning.
- Discussion between Doug and Heather about the number of units permitted on a lot under the proposed new zoning
- No action was taken by the board.
